




Hebrew: rfe[]m;, ma'asar, a tenth or tenth portion of something, from the participle mi, plus the noun for ten rf,[,, 'eser; literally, "from ten."

Greek: de,katoj, dekatos, a tenth of something, a tenth portion

## LAND GRANT ALONG WITH TITHE OBLIGATIONS (3.82) (PRU III 16.276)

"From the present day Nigmadu, son of Ammistamru king of Ugarit<sup>2</sup> gave (donated) the village<sup>3</sup> Uhnappu to Kar-Kushuh, son of Ana[nu] and to Apapa, the king's daughter, with its tithe (êš rê tu) with its custom-duties (miksu)4 with its gifts (širku). Nobody shall raise claims concerning Uhnappu against Kar-Kushuh and Apapa and against the sons of Apapa. He (the king) donated Uhnappu. Further: Kar-Kushuh is pure like the sun forever. Later he is (also) pure. The temple of Baal of the Hazi mountain and its priests shall not have claims to Kar-Kushuh.7"

Hammurapi's immediate successor, his son Samsu-iluna (1749-1712), continued with what may have been an edict of Ammi-ditana (1683–1647)<sup>2</sup> and concluded with Ammi-saduga (1646-1626). His laws recognize the tithe as the basic unit of taxation.
