


Is Jesus the fulfillment of OT revelation?



Luke 24:44, "Now He said to them, 'These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled'."

- 20 "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.
- 21 "Blessed are you who hunger now, for you shall be satisfied.

 Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh.
- 22 "Blessed are you when men hate you, and ostracize you, and insult you, and scorn your name as evil, for the sake of the Son of Man.
- 23 "Be glad in that day and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven. For in the same way their fathers used to treat the prophets.
- 24 "Woe to you who are rich, for you are receiving your comfort in full.
- 25 "Woe to you who are well-fed now, for you shall be hungry.

 Woe to you who laugh now, you shall mourn and weep.
- 26 "Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for their fathers used to treat the false prophets in the same way."

"Blessed" - Hebrew- ¬̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣̣ (ešer) – Happiness, bliss. Greek LXX (Septuagint) – μακάριος (makarios) – used in the beatitudes – "Blessed..."

Psalm 1:1, "How <u>blessed</u> is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, Nor stand in the path of sinners, nor sit in the seat of scoffers!"

"Woe"- Greek- οὐαί (ouaí); interjection of grief or indignation. It pronounces a calamity or curse.

Hebrew- 'ነአ $(\hat{o}y)$ - Woe! Alas! Oh!

(Num. 21:29; Isa. 10:1; Hos. 9:12; Matt. 11:21; 13:17; 7 woes of Matt. 23; Jude 11; Rev. 8:13)


"Weep"


Hebrew – ¬¬¬¬ (bākâ) to weep, cry, shed tears.

Greek – κλαίω (*klaiō*) – To weep, wail, lament, implying not only the shedding of tears, but also every external expression of grief.


"laugh"


Greek – $\gamma \in \lambda \acute{a}ω$ (geláō) – To laugh, be merry.





Numbers 11:13 "Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they <u>weep</u> before me, saying, 'Give us meat that we may eat!'




Jeremiah 9:1 Oh that my head were waters And my eyes a fountain of tears, that I might weep day and night for the slain of the daughter of my people!
