Paul's Epistle to the Romans



Rom. 1:13, “Now I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that I often planned to come to you (but was hindered until now), that I might have some fruit among you also, just as among the other Gentiles.”

Rom. 1:14, “I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to wise and to unwise.

Rom. 1:15, “So, as much as is in me, I am ready to preach the gospel to you who are in Rome also.”

Rom. 1:16, “For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation [deliverance] for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek.”

Mark 8:38, “For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him the Son of Man also will be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels.”

2 Tim. 1:8, “Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony of our Lord, nor of me His prisoner, but share with me in the sufferings for the gospel according to the power of God,”

Rom. 5:9, “Much more then, having now been justified by His blood [death], we shall be saved [future tense:delivered] from wrath [judgment] through Him.”

Rom. 1:17, “For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, ‘The just shall live by faith.’ ”

Literal Prophecy–Literal Fulfillment

Matt. 2:5, “So they said to him, ‘In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it is written by the prophet:

Matt. 2:6, “ ‘But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are not the least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you shall come a Ruler who will shepherd My people Israel.’ ”

Mic. 5:2, “But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel, whose goings forth are from of old [*qedem*], from everlasting [*‘olam*].”

Literal Prophecy–Literal Fulfillment

Psalm 22 (describing the death of the Messiah);

Psalm 110:1 (the Messiah will be seated on the right hand of God);

Isaiah 7:14 (the virgin birth);

9:1–2;

40:3 (the forerunner of the Messiah);

42:1–4;

52:13–53:12 (the rejection, atoning death, burial, and resurrection of the Messiah);

61:1–2a (the prophetic ministry of the Messiah);

Zechariah 9:9 (the ride into Jerusalem on a donkey);

Zechariah 11:4–14 (Messiah will be sold out for 30 pieces of silver);

Malachi 3:1 (the forerunner of the Messiah); et. al.

Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment

Matt. 2:15, “and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, ‘Out of Egypt I called My Son.’ ”

Hos. 11:1, “When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son.”

Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment

Num. 23:21, “He has not observed iniquity in

Jacob,

Nor has He seen wickedness in **Israel.**

The LORD his God is with **him,**

And the shout of a King is ~~among them~~ with **him.**”

Most English translations have “among them.”

Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment

Num. 23:21, “He has not observed iniquity in **Jacob**,
Nor has He seen wickedness in **Israel**.
The LORD his God is with **him**,
And the shout of a King is ~~among them~~ with **him**.”

Num. 23:22, “God brings **them [m.pl.]** out of Egypt; He has strength like a wild ox.”

Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment

Num. 24:7, “He shall pour water from his buckets, and his seed shall be in many waters. His king shall be higher than Gog [not Agag], and his kingdom shall be exalted.

Num. 24:8, “God brings him out of Egypt; He has strength like a wild ox; He shall consume the nations, his enemies; He shall break their bones and pierce them with his arrows.”

Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment

Num. 24:9, “He bows down, he lies down as a lion; and as a lion, who shall rouse him? Blessed is he who blesses you, and cursed is he who curses you.”

Gen. 12:2; Gen. 49:10

Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment

Matt. 2:15, “and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, ‘Out of Egypt I called My Son.’ ”

Hos. 11:1, “When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son.”

Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment

Matt. 15:7, “Hypocrites! Well did Isaiah prophesy about you, saying:

Matt. 15:8, “ ‘These people draw near to Me with their mouth, and honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me.

Matt. 15:9, “ ‘And in vain they worship Me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.’ ”

Isa. 29:13, “Therefore the Lord said: ‘Inasmuch as these people draw near with their mouths and honor Me with their lips, but have removed their hearts far from Me, and their fear toward Me is taught by the commandment of men,’ ”

Literal History–Application

Matt. 2:17, “Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying:

Matt. 2:18, “ ‘A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted, because they are no more.’ ”

Jer. 31:15, “Thus says the LORD: ‘A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation and bitter weeping, Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted for her children, because they are no more.’ ”

Summary

Midrash Rabbah 63:11, “Hence it is written as in the verse, and I will no more make you a reproach of famine among the nations.”
