

mystery cloak and dagger, closed book, conundrum, enigma, problem, puzzle, question, riddle, secrecy, secret, teaser admitted

- mystery (OED) noun (plural mysteries)
  1 something that is difficult or impossible to understand or explain.
  - secrecy or obscurity.
  - a person or thing whose identity or nature is puzzling or unknown.
- 2 a novel, play, or film dealing with a puzzling crime.
- 3 (mysteries) the secret rites of an ancient or tribal religion, to which only initiates are admitted.
  - archaic: the Christian Eucharist

## mysticism ('mıstı sızəm) n

- 1 belief in or experience of a reality surpassing normal human understanding or experience, especially a reality perceived as essential to the nature of life.
- 2 a system of contemplative prayer and spirituality aimed at achieving direct intuitive experience of the divine.
- 3 obscure or confused belief or thought.
