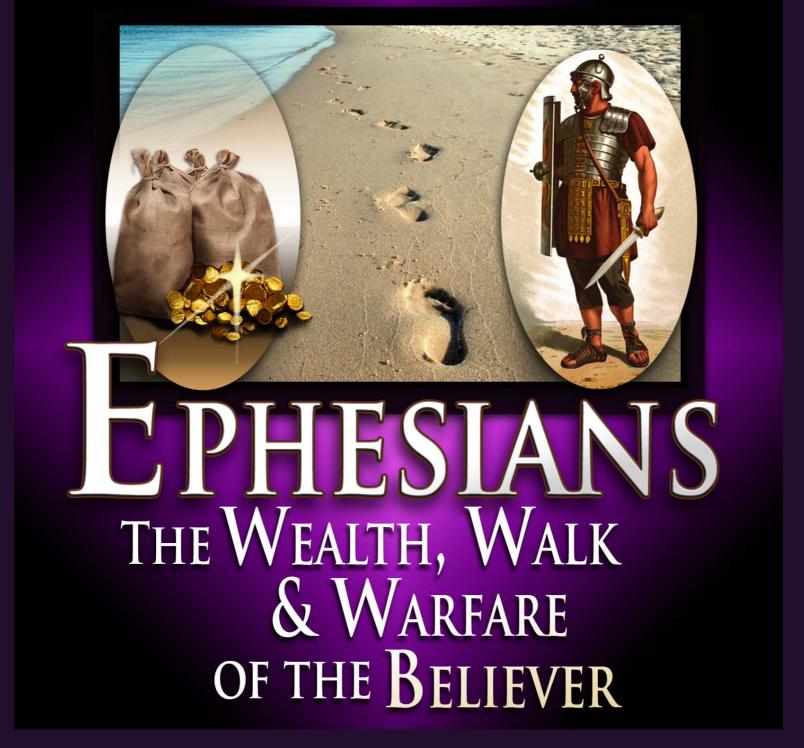

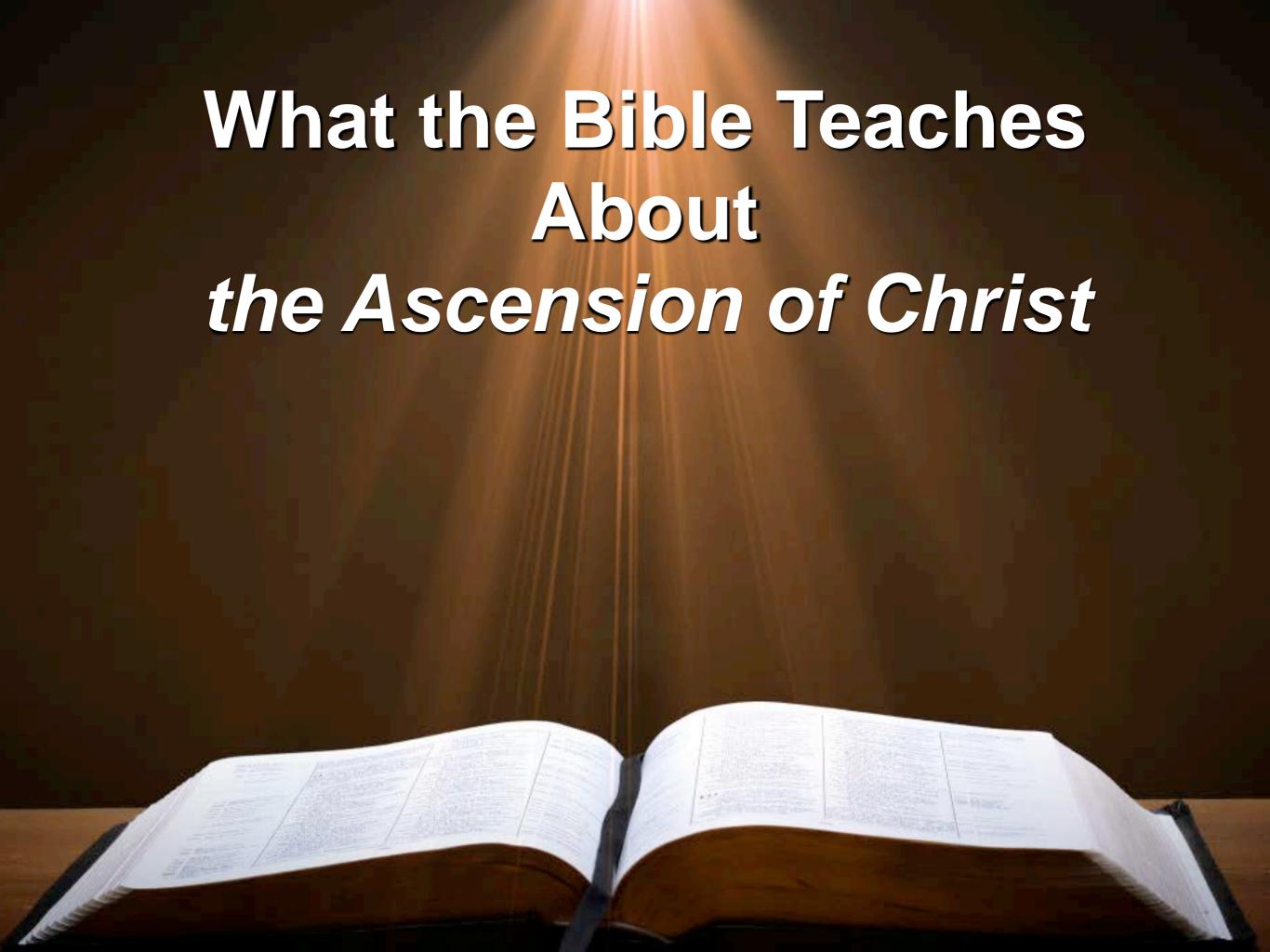

Acts 1:9, "Now when He had spoken these things, while they watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight.

Acts 1:10, "And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel,"

Acts 1:11, "who also said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven.'"



Heb. 4:14, "Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession."

- 1. FOUR Messianic Psalms: Psalm 89 (Davidic Covenant); Psa. 110 (Session); Dan. 7:13–14 (given the kingdom); Psa. 2 (takes the kingdom); Psa. 132 (ascent to the Temple)
- 2. The terms Son of Man and Son of God; Son of David and King of kings and Lord of lords
- 3. The Davidic Covenant as the foundation for understanding all of the above
- 4. The Melchizedekian priesthood and its fulfillment in Christ







1. The term "Session of Christ" derives from the use of the Latin term "sessionem" meaning the seating. Currently Christ is seated at the Right Hand of God the Father in Heaven. (Acts 7:55; Ps. 110:1; Rom. 8:34; Col. 3:1; Heb. 1:3, 13; 8:1; 10:12; 12:2; 1 Peter 3:22)

Psa. 110:1, "The LORD said to my Lord, 'Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool.'

Heb. 1:3, "who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,"

2. The place at the right hand of the Father is a place of authority, where He, as a Man, is raised to a position of authority over the angels.

Heb. 1:4, "having become so much better than the angels, as He has by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they.

Heb. 1:5, "For to which of the angels did He ever say: 'You are My Son, Today I have begotten You'? [Psa. 2:7] And again: 'I will be to Him a Father, and He shall be to Me a Son'?" [2 Sam. 7:14] Heb. 2:7, "You have made him a little lower than the angels; You have crowned him with glory and honor, and set him over the works of Your hands.

Heb. 2:8, "'You have put all things in subjection under his feet.' [Psa. 8:5] For in that He put all in subjection under him, He left nothing that is not put under him. But now we do not yet see all things put under him.

Heb. 2:9, "But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone."

3. During the Session, Christ is preparing dwelling places for the Church Age believers in Heaven.

John 14:2, "In My Father's house are many dwelling places; if it were not so, I would have told you; for I go to prepare a place for you."

4. Jesus Christ is currently functioning in His role as our High Priest.

Heb. 4:14, "Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.

Heb. 4:15, "For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin." (Heb. 3:1; 5:5–10; 7:17–21, 26–27; 8:1, 3)

5. One role of the High Priest is to be our legal Advocate before the Supreme Judge of the universe, against the charges of Satan.

1 John 2:1, "My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous."

6. Part of the role of Advocate involves prayerful intercession for each believer. The model for Christ's intercession is His prayer in John 17.

Rom. 8:34, "Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us."

7. He is forming His body, a new people, to rule and reign with Him in the Millennial Kingdom.
