


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How Does Love Act? Ephesians 5:25–33; 1 Corinthians 13:4–7



Gen. 3:15, The Aspect of the Judgment of Sin for Both the Woman and the Man



Women trend toward wanting to be the leader

Solution: Submit to the leadership of the husband

General trend of men

Both reflect the core arrogant, "me first," orientation of the sin nature.

"But he shall domineeringly rule over you." [~RD]

Men trend toward being autocratic, as well as abdicating responsibility

Solution: Love your wife as Christ loved the Church

Eph. 5:25, "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her,

Eph. 5:26, "that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word,

Eph. 5:27, "that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish.

Eph. 5:28, "So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself. Eph. 5:29, "For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church, Eph. 5:30, "For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones. Eph. 5:31, " 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' Eph. 5:32, "This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church.

Eph. 5:33, "Nevertheless let each one of you in particular so love his own wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband."



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Initial Observations

- 1. Husbands are to love their wife as Christ loved the church and gave Himself for her. 2. Husbands ought to love their own wives as their own

- 3. Illustration: no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes, i.e., husbands are to nourish and cherish their wife as Christ does the Church. 4. We need to understand the mystery of Christ and the church to improve our own expression of love for our
- wives.
- 5. We are to love our own wife as we love our selves.

The one and only acceptable starting point for defining love is the Bible and what the Bible says about God's love.

<u>1 John 4:16, "... God is love."</u>

God who loves.

This love is characterized by a volitional determination to unfailingly love the person, a selfless mental attitude, faithful loyalty, (Deut. 7:7–9)

Deut. 7:7, "The LORD did not set His love on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any other people, for you were the least of all peoples;"

1. The Old Testament (OT) speaks of God's love in terms that emphasize God's loyalty and faithfulness to His promises, especially to His people. A love not based on any merit in the object of love, but on the integrity of

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
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
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
