2 Corinthians 12:1–13

Paul's visions and revelations attest to his apostleship. 2 Cor. 12:1-10

A vision is a visual experience given with a specific message to a specific person. vs. 1

A revelation is a revealing or making known a truth before unknown. apokalupsis vs. 1

- I. Of Visions, 2 Corinthians 12:1-6
  - A. Visions Paul received in Acts:
  - 1. His conversion experience, Acts 9:3-7; 26:23-24,
  - 2. A man in Macedonia, Acts 16:9,
  - 3. At Corinth, "do not be afraid ..." Acts 18:9,
  - 4. At Jerusalem, "get out of Jerusalem ..." 22:17-18,
  - 5. In Jerusalem after arrest, "Be of good cheer..." 23:11,
  - 6. In the storm, "Do not be afraid ..." Acts 27:23-33

2 Corinthians 12:1–13

- B. The vision of a man caught up to Paradise, vv. 2-6
  - 1. The timing, 14 years earlier 42-44 A.D. v. 2
  - 2. Who was the man "caught up"? vv. 2-3
  - Paul's personal experience told in the 3rd person,
  - The context requires it,
  - The personal eye witness pronouns, v. 1-3; v. 5
  - The known things that cannot be known require it.

# 3. The experience:

- 1. What Paul knew; v. 2a,
  - He knew the man, "oida" perceive, v. 2b,
- He knew the man was "caught up", to snatch away, v. 2; 1 Thess. 4:17
- To the "third heaven", v. 2 to Paradise v. 4
- 2. He did not know "whether in the body or out of the body" vv. 2b, 3
- 3. He heard inexpressible words unspeakable v. 4
- 4. "of such a one I will boast; yet of myself I will not boast except of my infirmities." v. 5

II. Paul's thorn in the flesh, 2 Cor. 12:7-10

A revelation is a revealing of truth, - making known a truth before unknown. Ephesians 3:5

Other revelations Paul received:

His conversion experience, Acts 9:3-6

Concerning spiritual gifts, 1 Cor. 14:6

His receiving the revelation of the mystery, Gal. 1:12; Eph. 3:3–6

II. Paul's thorn in the flesh, 2 Cor. 12:7-10

1. Why Paul? "Lest I should be exalted ..." v. 7a

2. What was it? "a thorn in the flesh ... a messenger of Satan." v. 7b

3. How did he get it? "was given to me ... v. 7c

II. Paul's thorn in the flesh, 2 Cor. 12:7-10

4. What was Paul's response? "I pleaded for the removal of this thorn three times. ..." v. 8

- 5. What was God's answer? "My grace is sufficient for My strength is made perfect in weakness." v. 7c
- 6. Paul's response? "... most gladly I will boast in infirmities ... when am I weak then I am strong." vv. 9-10
