


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
REASONS WHY SOME QUESTION THE RELIABILITY OF THE BIBLE



- Rise of Historical Criticism in Biblical Studies
 - Presupposition that the writings of the Bible are only human documents and went through an evolutionary process.
 - View that the various biblical documents of the Old and New Testament were not written by eyewitnesses or reliable sources.
 - Conviction that they are unreliable historically and theologically.




Due to the interpretive differences between biblical conservatives and biblical critics, archaeological interpretation relating to the Bible has produced two separate schools of thought. Those who belong to these schools are classified as "Minimalists" and "Maximalists."



Archaeology and the Bible

Minimalist: Sees little correspondence between the Bible and archaeological data; the archaeological data has priority in interpretation.

Archaeology provides little - but often contradictory - evidence concerning the question of biblical historicity




Archaeology and the Bible

Maximalist: Correspondence is sought between the Bible and archaeological record; the biblical data has priority in interpretation.

Archaeology provides evidence that the Bible is a reliable historical document


Purposes of Biblical Archaeology

- 1. Confirming the word of the Bible.
- 2. Correcting the words of the Bible.
- 3. Clarifying the world of the Bible.
- 4. Complementing the witness of the Bible.




- It frequently <u>illustrates</u> and illuminates the Bible.
 - It may assist in determining fixed dates for biblical events (e.g. Patriarchs, Exodus).


 It may clear up the interpretation of obscure texts (e. g. horns of the altar).



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 - It can contribute information concerning customs and cultures of Bible times (e.g. city gates, the Canaanites).
 - It can help us to correct misinterpretations.




- It often <u>supplements</u> the information given in the Bible.
 - It sometimes supplies details missing in the biblical account (e.g. Sargon II, King Mesha of Moab).
 - It often provides information not found in the Bible at all (e.g. Battle of Qarqar, Battle of Carchemish, intertestamental period).



- It regularly <u>authenticates</u> the Bible.
 - It has destroyed false theories concerning the Bible.
 - It has demonstrated the accuracy of the Bible (e.g. Solomonic gates, Hittites, Pilate inscription, MT).






The Importance of Eyewitness Testimony

Credible eyewitness testimony requires a sustained, up-close type of exposure.







The Importance of Eyewitness Testimony



The Importance of Eyewitness Testimony Factors that Support the Biblical Texts

- Generally the biblical authors were eyew nesses of the events and words that they recorded, or they interviewed eyewitnesses to the events or words
- Short time between when the events occurred a when these events and words are recorded.
- Short time span from the writing of the autographs
 and that of our copies of the New Testament.
- Multitude of manuscripts of Old and New Testament.



The Credibility of Historical Events Determined by Temporal Proximity to the Record of the Event




The Non-Mythological Nature of the New Testament

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


Development of Myth

Near Eastern experts recognize the development of myth over time:

- ☐ History can be made into myth
- ☐ Myth can become more mythical
- ☐ Myth does not become *more simple*, believable and historical over time.

Therefore, the later, more simple, believable, and historical account of creation in Genesis is not dependent on *earlier* mythical Mesopotamian accounts. Rather, the event of creation as documented in the simpler Genesis account was made into myth.








Fragmentary Nature of Archaeological Evidence





- (1) Only a fraction of what was made or written in the past has survived.
- (2) Only a fraction of the available archaeological sites have been surveyed.

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




"Absence of evidence is not evidence of absence."




A Faith Based on Facts

"Are there striking similarities between the Bible and the religion it describes and the ancient Near Eastern literatures and the religions found therein? There certainly are, and we should be surprised to find it otherwise. Israel is described in the Bible as a full participant in its world. But what we find is that those similarities are not the defining features of the Bible or of biblical religion. This is unmistakably evident to anyone who takes the Bible as a whole ... if we look at the Bible as a whole, where else is there anything like it in its world, or indeed, in the world? ... in their views of the origins of the world, one need only read the biblical accounts alongside any other to be impressed that in spite of superficial similarities of expression, the two pieces are in every other way different." Global Catastrophe – Similar Details Reported

There are at least 213 recorded "Flood Legends." Although tainted by time and differing religious embellishment, similar details are preserved in all of them which can be also found in the complete narrative of the Book of Genesis.

The Case of Jericho

Excavations at Jericho and the analysis of Canaanite pottery samples by archaeologist, Bryant Wood, have demonstrated that Jericho was conquered c. 1400 BC.

- Jericho was a fortified city in 15th century BC (Joshua 2:5-7,15)
- The city was destroyed by fire (Joshua 6:24)
- The fortification walls collapsed (Joshua 6:20)
- The destruction was in the spring due to grain storage (Joshua 2:6, 3:15, 5:10)
- The grain stored in the city was not consumed indicating a short siege (Joshua 6:15,20)
- The grain was never used by the inhabitants or invaders (Joshua 6:17-18)

The Case of the Hittites

A century ago the Hittites were unknown in any documents outside the Bible and did not exist in the archaeological record. Liberal scholars argued they were a fictious people invented by the biblical authors.

Hittites are mentioned 47x in the Old Testament

Famous Hittites of the Bible

God claimed Israel's "mother" was a "Hittite" (Ezek. 16)

Abraham bought burial cave from "Ephron the Hittite" (Gen. 23)
One of Esau's wives was the daughter of a Hittite (Gen. 36)
David murdered his soldier "Uriah the Hittite" (2 Sam. 11)
Solomon's wives were from among the Hittites (1 Kgs. 11)



- Enhanced awareness of the nuances in the biblical context makes more accurate translation of biblical text possible.











Meggido Church

Discovered in 2005 at Meggido Prison by inmate Ramil Razilo, this 3rd century AD church has become the oldest church in the Holy Land.

- Christianity was established early in the common era
- The Greek mosaic floor (16x32 ft) inscription confirms Jesus was being worshipped as "God" in the early church rather than being a later development. It reads:



Meggido Church Inscription

- "The God-Loving Akeptous [name of the female worshipper] has offered this table to the God Jesus Christ as a Memorial."
- Apparently, the mosaic floor was financed by a Roman military officer named "Gaianus," and laid by "Brutius."
