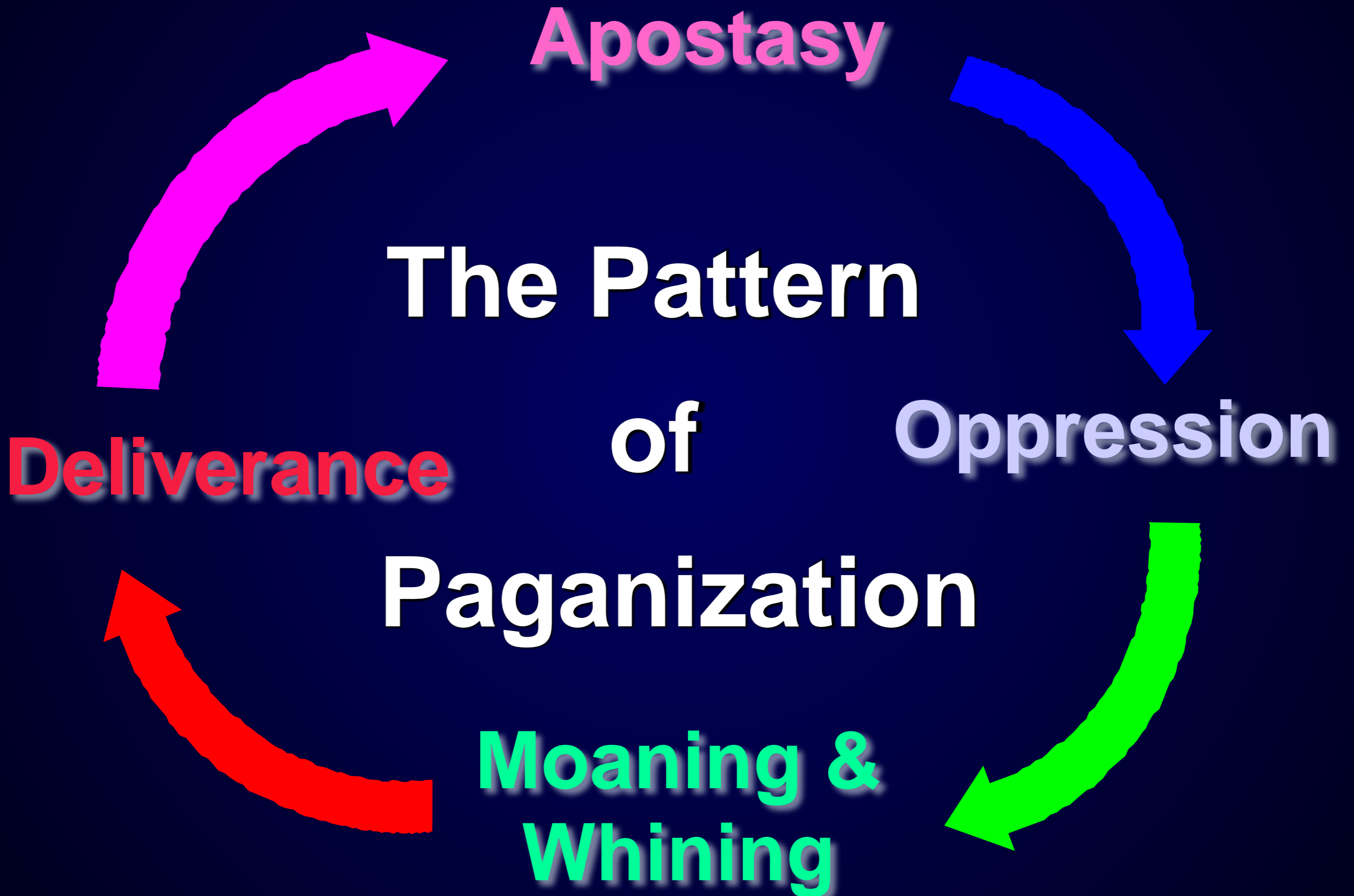

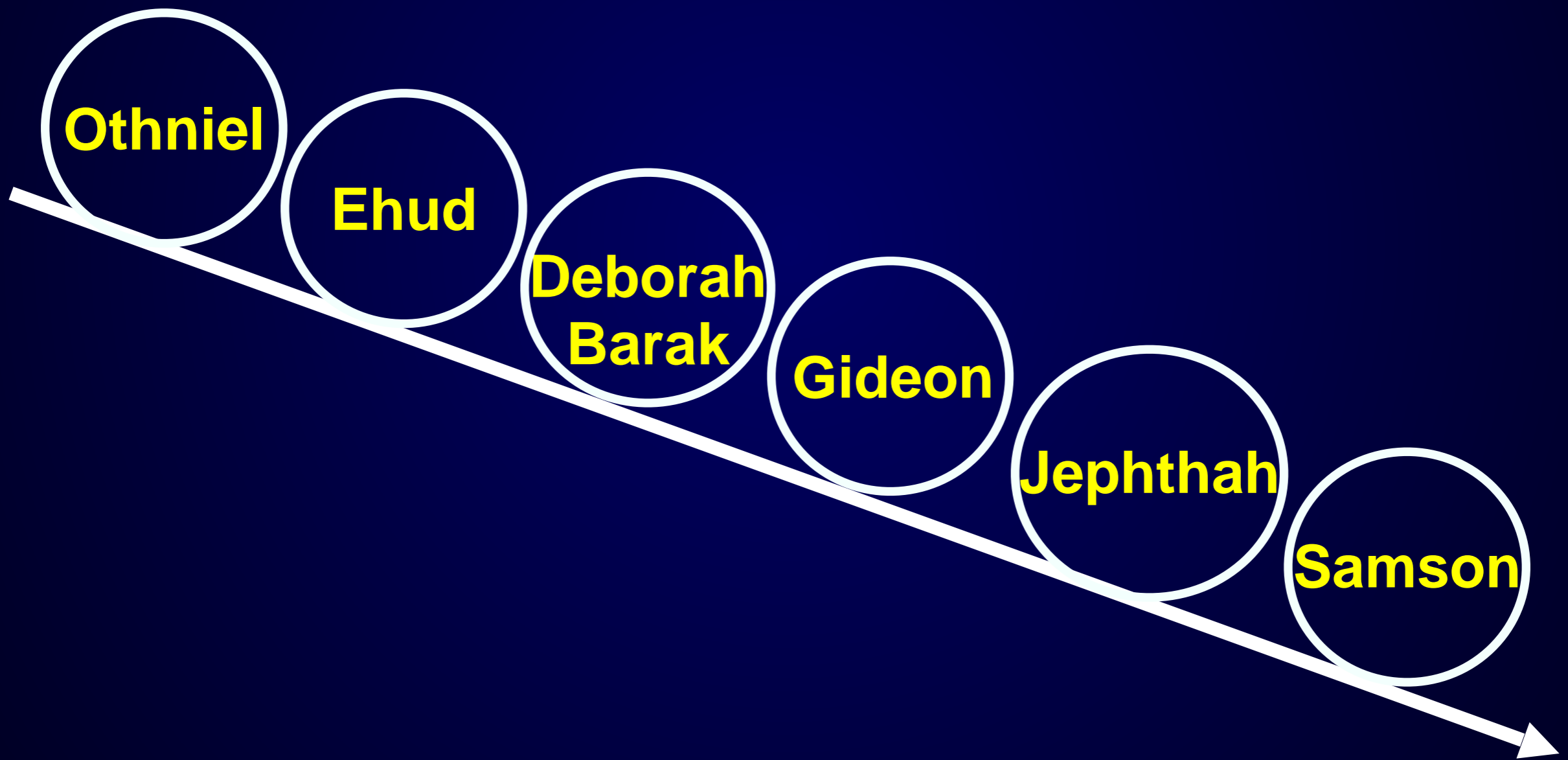

Sliding into Paganism in *Judges*



Judg. 2:22, “so that through them I may test Israel, whether they will keep the ways of the Lord, to walk in them as their fathers kept them, or not.

Judg. 2:23, “Therefore the Lord left those nations, without driving them out immediately; nor did He deliver them into the hand of Joshua.”

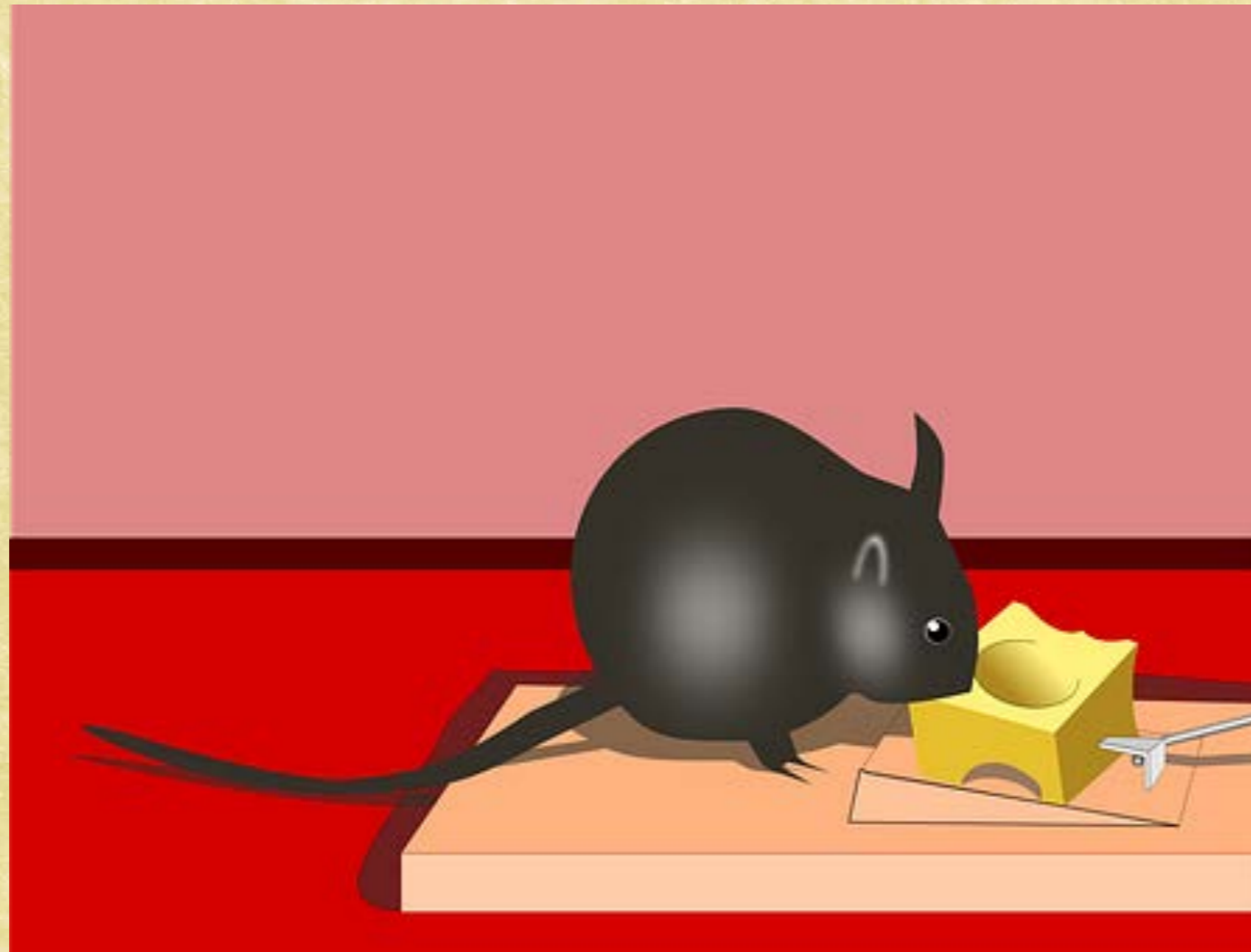

1. Definition: A test is any situation in life when the believer has the option of choosing between applying doctrine or using his own resources to solve the problem.

2. Tests are not merely difficult situations, serious decisions, or handling unforeseen obstacles. If you think this, you have already lost the battle.

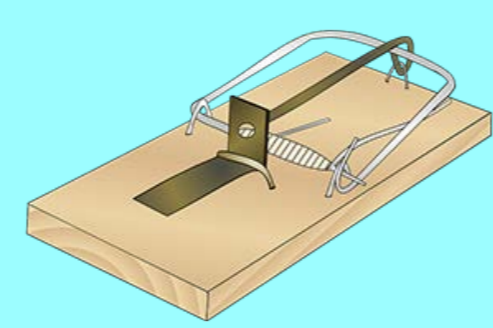

3. Tests are the opportunities to demonstrate what biblical truth we have learned and assimilated into our souls.

**James 1:2, “My brethren, think about it as joyful when you encounter various tests,
James 1:3, “because you know that the evaluation of what you believe produces endurance.**

James 1:4, “But let endurance have its maturing work, that you may be mature and complete, lacking nothing.”

Tests may originate from one of three sources:

4. Tests arise from our own sin nature.

5. Some tests are the result of living in a fallen world, and one under the control of Satan, the “god of this age”. 2 Cor. 4:4

6. Some further tests arise from the consequences of our own bad decisions based on the sin nature.

7. The solution to every test is found in the character of God, the Spirit of God, and the revealed Word of God.

8. There is no problem, no circumstance, no situation—good, bad, wonderful or disastrous—that is too great for the grace or power of God.

9. The central issue therefore in the Christian life begins with being in fellowship and then proceeds on the basis of the Faith-Rest Drill (FRD).

10. Israel failed and we fail because we:

a. fail to make learning and applying the Word of God the number one priority in our life.

**b. fail to walk by the Spirit, abide in Christ,
walk in the light, consider ourselves dead
to sin.**

c. fail to trust God exclusively and radically.

11. Illustrations of Divine testing in Israel.

Gen. 22:1, “Now it came about after these things, that God tested Abraham, and said to him, ‘Abraham!’ And he said, ‘Here I am.’ ”

The Ten Tests of Abraham for Spiritual Growth

**1. The test to go to a new land and to
leave the family behind.
Gen. 12:1–9 (Land; FRD)**

Gen. 12:1, “Now the LORD said to Abram, ‘Go forth from your country, and from your relatives and from your father’s house, to the **land which I will show you;’ ”**

Gen. 12:2, “And I will make you a great **nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great; And so you shall be a **blessing**;”**

**Gen. 12:3, “And I will bless those who
bless you, and the one who curses
you I will curse. And in you all the
families of the earth shall be
blessed.”**

2. The test to trust God by staying in the land during the famine.

Gen. 12:10–20 [Land; FRD / Grace Orientation (G/O)]



Gen. 12:7, “And the LORD appeared to Abram and said, ‘To your descendants I will give this **land.’ So he built an altar there to the LORD who had appeared to him.”**

3. The test to treat Lot with grace and generosity.

Gen. 13:1–17. (Land; G/O)

Gen. 13:14, “And the LORD said to Abram, after Lot had separated from him, ‘Now lift up your eyes and look from the place where you are, northward and southward and eastward and westward;

Gen. 13:15, “ ‘for all the land which you see, I will give it to you and to your descendants forever.’ ”

Gen. 13:16, “And I will make your descendants as the dust of the earth; so that if anyone can number the dust of the earth, then your descendants can also be numbered.”

4. The test to protect and defend his neighbors. Gen. 14:1–17 (Blessing; G/O)

**9. The test of hospitality to his visitors.
Gen. 18:1–15 (Blessing; G/O)**

**10. The test of intercession to one who had abused his generosity. Gen. 18:16–33
