
Judg. 11:29, "Then the Spirit of the Lord came upon Jephthah, and he passed through Gilead and Manasseh, and passed through Mizpah of Gilead; and from Mizpah of Gilead he advanced toward the people of Ammon.

Judg. 11:30, "And Jephthah made a vow to the Lord, and said, 'If You will indeed deliver the people of Ammon into my hands,

Judg. 11:31, "then it will be that whatever comes out of the doors of my house to meet me, when I return in peace from the people of Ammon, shall surely be the Lord's, and I will offer it up as a burnt offering." ~NKJV Heb. 11:32, "And what more shall I say? For the time would fail me to tell of <u>Gideon</u> and <u>Barak</u> and <u>Samson</u> and <u>Jephthah</u>, also of <u>David</u> and <u>Samuel</u> and the prophets:

HALOT "sacrifice which is wholly burned, comprising domestic animals and occasionally birds"

DCH "burnt offering in specifice entirely consumed by fire

DCH "burnt offering, i.e., sacrifice entirely consumed by fire, offered daily morning and evening"

BDB "n.f. (noun, feminine) whole burnt-offering (that which goes up ($\sqrt{6}$) to heaven (al. on altar))

Gen. 28:20, "Then Jacob vowed a vow, saying, 'If God will be with me, and keep me in this way that I am going, and give me bread to eat and clothing to put on,

Gen. 28:21, "'so that I come back to my father's house in peace, then the LORD shall be my God.

Gen. 28:22, "'And this stone which I have set as a pillar shall be God's house, and of all that You give me I will surely give a tenth to You.'"

Num. 21:2, "So Israel made a vow to the LORD, and said, 'If You will indeed deliver this people into my hand, then I will utterly destroy their cities.'

1 Sam. 1:11, "Then she made a vow and said, 'O LORD of hosts, if You will indeed look on the affliction of Your maidservant and remember me, and not forget Your maidservant, but will give Your maidservant a male child, then I will give him to the LORD all the days of his life, and no razor shall come upon his head.'

Evidence of child sacrifice

<u>Deut. 12:31</u>, "You shall not worship the LORD your God in that way; for every abomination to the LORD which He hates they have done to their gods; for they burn even their sons and daughters in the fire to their gods."

<u>Deut. 18:10</u>, "There shall not be found among you anyone who makes his son or his daughter pass through the fire, or one who practices witchcraft, or a soothsayer, or one who interprets omens, or a sorcerer,"

Evidence of child sacrifice


- 2 Kings 3:26, "And when the king of Moab saw that the battle was too fierce for him, he took with him seven hundred men who drew swords, to break through to the king of Edom, but they could not.
- 2 Kings 3:27, "Then he took his eldest son who would have reigned in his place, and offered him as a burnt offering upon the wall; and there was great indignation against Israel. So they departed from him and returned to their own land."

Evidence from Carthage

"To our lady, to Tanit, the face of Baal, and to our lord, to Baal-hamon that which was vowed by [A], son of [B], son of [C], because he [that is, the deity] heard [A's] voice and blessed him."

"Agamemnon, Captain of Hellas, there can be no way of setting your ships free, till the offering you promised Artemis is given to her. You had vowed to render Her in sacrifice the loveliest thing each year should bear. You have vowed long since the loveliness which Clytemnestra had borne to you, your daughter, Iphegenia. Summon your daughter now and keep your word."



Typical 1st Century AD Jewish Home


Living and Sleeping Quarters

Daytime Living Quarters where vulnerable or especially valuable animals were stored at night




The homes of poor families were small and plain. They were built of rough stone (or mud-brick) walls and roofs of woven branches covered with clay. Living spaces were used for household work-cooking and weaving. At night, the family's domestic animals were housed in the lower level.

Deliberate, detailed focus on the sacrifice

The climax of the the narrative

Test of the faithfulness of Abraham

God initiates the command to sacrifice Isaac

Abraham is obedient, and trusts God to do the right thing.

Abraham loves his only son

Confirmed Abraham's faith

Judges 11

Abridged, quick account of only five words

Appears to be extraneous to the story

Tests the faithfulness of God to paganized Israel

Jephthah initiates from a pagan theology

Jephthah sinfully and abusively destroys the life of his daughter and future.

Jephthah seems more concerned about himself, his daughter goes alone to the mountain.

Confirmed Jephthah's faithlessness

Judg. 11:35, "And it came to pass, when he saw her, that he tore his clothes, and said, 'Alas, my daughter! You have brought me very low! You are among those who trouble me! For I have given my word to the LORD, and I cannot go back on it."

Lev. 27:1, "Now the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, Lev. 27:2, " 'Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: "When a man consecrates by a vow certain persons to the LORD, according to your valuation,

Lev. 27:3, " '"if your valuation is of a male from twenty years old up to sixty years old, then your valuation shall be fifty shekels of silver, according to the shekel of the sanctuary.

Lev. 27:4, " "If it is a female, then your valuation shall be thirty shekels;

Lev. 27:5, " "and if from five years old up to twenty years old, then your valuation for a male shall be twenty shekels, and for a female ten shekels;" "
