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

1. Philistines: according to Gen. 10:14 the Philistines are descendants of the Casluhim (from which came the Philistines and Caphtorim). They are also connected to the Cherethites in Ezek. 25:15–16; Zeph. 2:4, 5; Jer. 47:4;


2. Philistines were in the land during the time of Abraham, 2100–2000 BC.

1. The significance of barrenness is not some sin on the part of this woman. There were certainly many other barren women in the Scripture that are not mentioned. Why are these mentioned?

Remember "fruitfulness" was a divine mandate and the expected norm.

And a lack of fruitfulness was part of the stages of divine discipline for Israel.

<u>Gen. 1:22</u>, "And God blessed them, saying, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.' "

<u>Gen. 9:1,</u> "So God blessed Noah and his sons, and said to them: 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth.' "

Gen. 9:7, "And as for you, be fruitful and multiply; Bring forth abundantly in the earth and multiply in it."

Blessing

Lev. 26:9, "For I will look on you favorably and make you fruitful, multiply you and confirm My covenant with you."

<u>Deut. 28:4,</u> "Blessed shall be the <u>fruit of your body</u>, the produce of your ground and the increase of your herds, the increase of your cattle and the offspring of your flocks."

Judgment (Cursing)

2. In specific cases, God intervened and closed the wombs of some women.

<u>Gen. 20:18</u>, "for the LORD had closed up all the wombs of the house of Abimelech because of Sarah, Abraham's wife."

<u>Gen. 30:2</u>, "And Jacob's anger was aroused against Rachel, and he said, 'Am I in the place of God, who has withheld from you the fruit of the womb?'"

3. Scripture makes an issue out of the infertility of six women:

Sarah, Gen. 11:30; *Rebekah*, Gen. 25:21; Rachel, 29:31;

The mother of Samson, Judges 13:2;

Hannah, 1 Sam. 1;

Elisabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, Luke 1:7.

4. Barrenness was considered a reproach.

<u>Gen. 30:23</u>, "And she conceived and bore a son, and said, 'God has taken away my <u>reproach</u>.' "

Luke 1:25, " 'Thus the Lord has dealt with me, in the days when He looked on me, to take away my <u>reproach</u> among people.' "

5. The absence of barren women indicates Israel's spirituality and divine blessing; the presence of barren women indicates Israel's carnality and divine judgment.

<u>Gen. 35:11</u>, "Also God said to him: 'I am God Almighty. Be fruitful and multiply; a nation and a company of nations shall proceed from you, and kings shall come from your body.' "

Ex. 23:26, "There shall be no one miscarrying or barren in your land; I will fulfill the number of your days."

<u>Lev. 26:3–4</u>, "If you walk in My statutes and keep My commandments, and perform them, then I will give you rain in its season, the land shall yield its produce, and the trees of the field shall yield their fruit"

Lev. 26:9, "For I will look on you favorably and make you fruitful, multiply you and confirm My covenant with you."

Deut. 7:14, "You shall be blessed above all peoples; there shall not be a male or female barren among you or among your livestock."

6. Thus the barren womb in these women pictures the emptiness and lifelessness of Israel specifically, and mankind in general. This will only be rectified in the coming Kingdom.

Isa. 54:1, " 'Sing, O barren, you who have not borne! Break forth into singing, and cry aloud, you who have not labored with child! For more are the children of the desolate than the children of the married woman,' says the LORD."

In each case God miraculously brings forth life where there is no life. This is a picture of regeneration. Only God can solve the problem of spiritual birth.

8. The barren womb is a type of the virgin womb of Mary. There the solution to the barren womb is the new life in the incarnation of the God-man, Jesus Christ.
