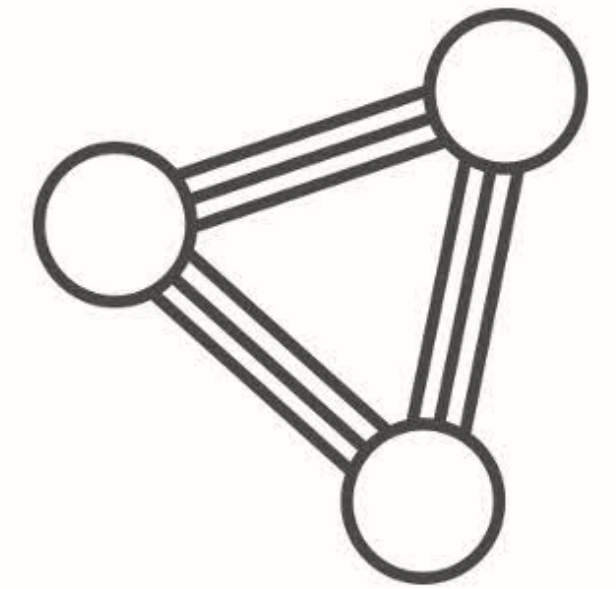

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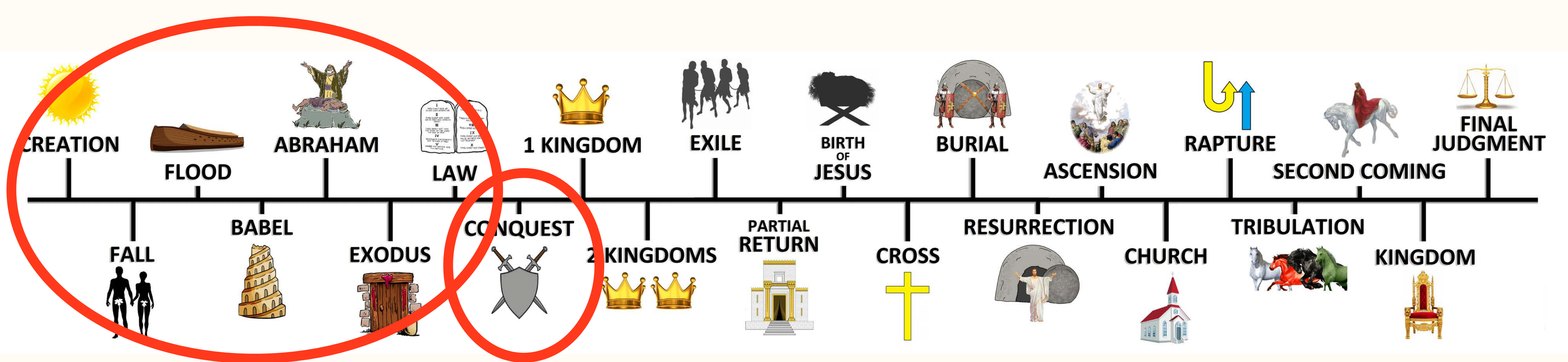

Type of Suffering:

5. Denial of rewards.

Affects: Believers

Believers will suffer loss when it is time for Jesus to hand out rewards if they have not lived in obedience to Him.

2 Cor. 5:10, “For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.”

1 Cor. 3:11, “For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

1 Cor. 3:12, “Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw,

1 Cor. 3:13, “each one’s work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one’s work, of what sort it is.

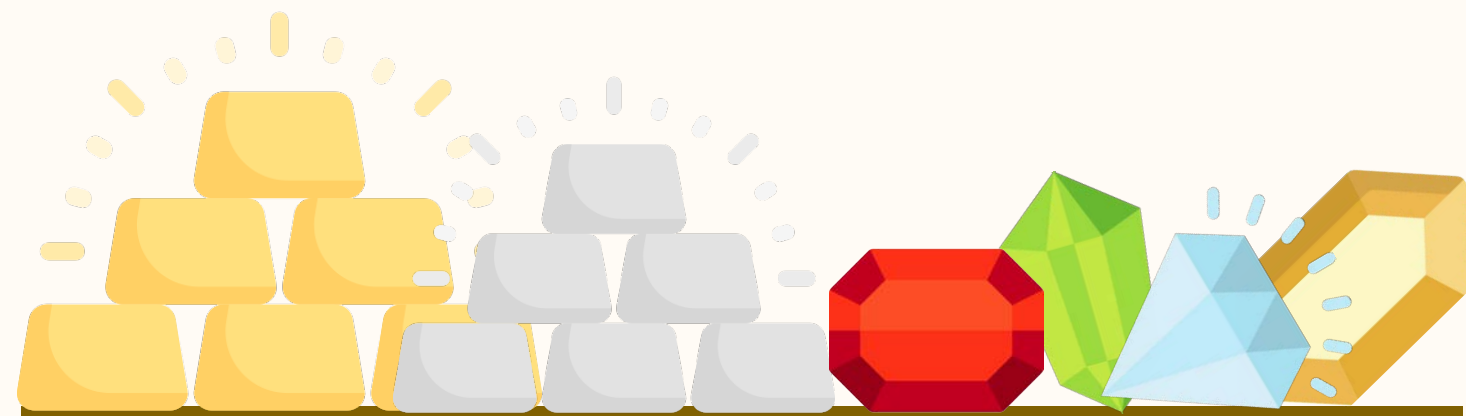
1 Cor. 3:14, “If anyone’s work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward.

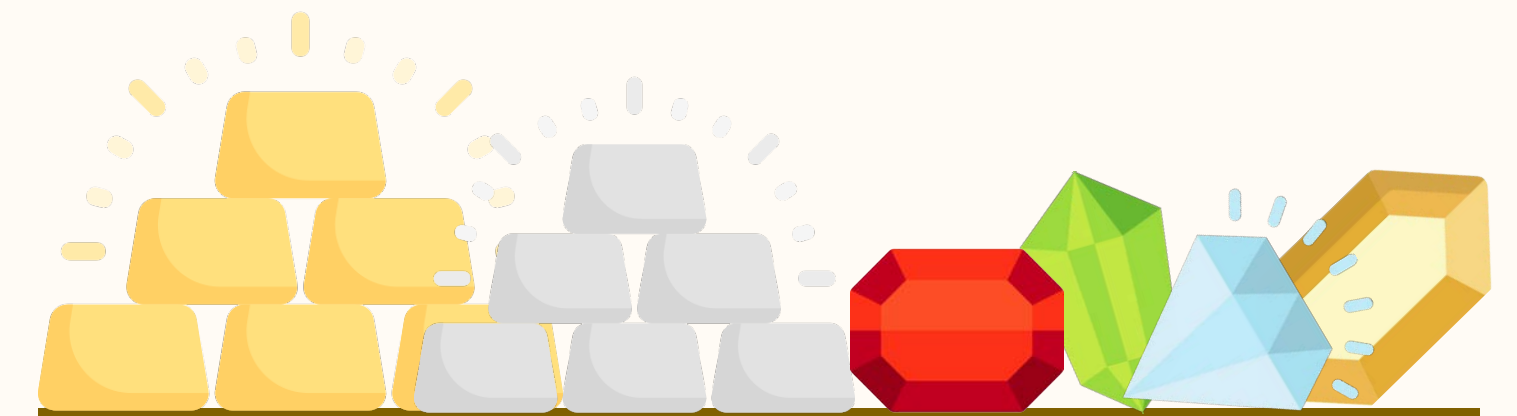

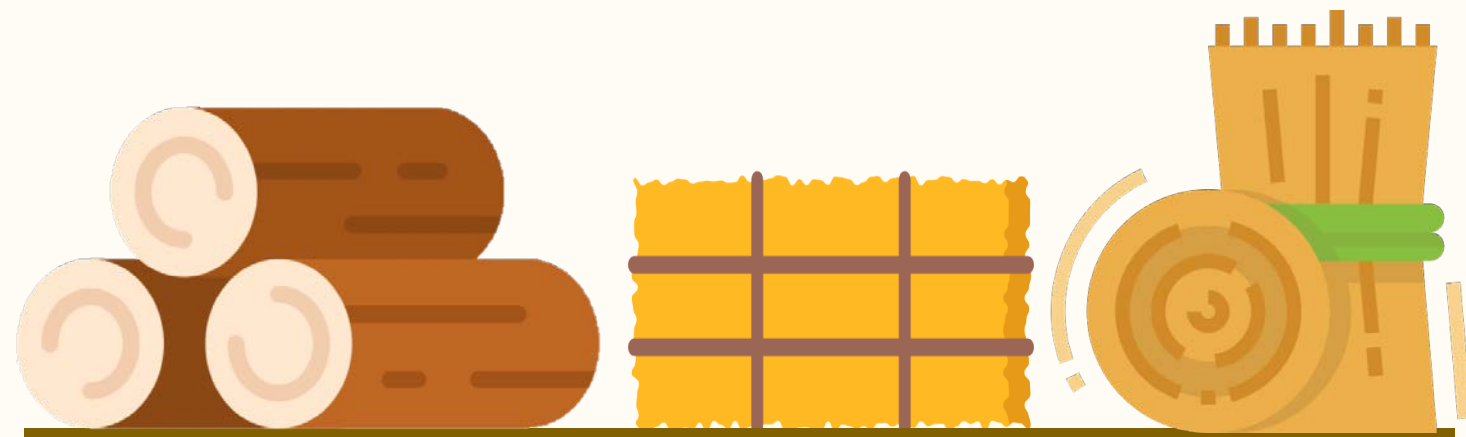

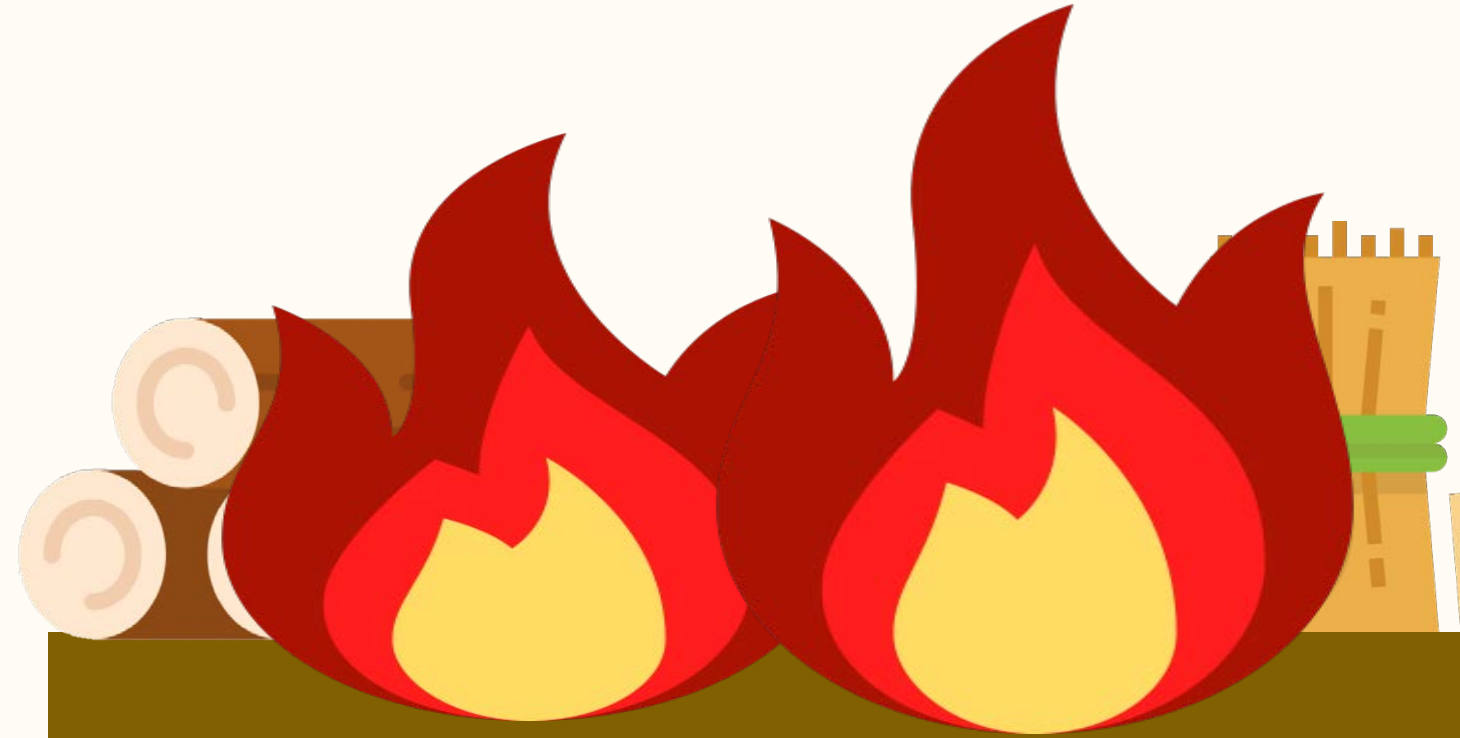

Type of Suffering:

6. Eternal suffering in the Lake of Fire.

Affects: Unbelievers

Unbelievers who do not respond to God's call to be reconciled with Him will suffer for eternity in the Lake of Fire, together with fallen angels and Satan.

I. Direct: Suffering due to sin (Direct consequences of man's sin)

1. Sickness and death due to the Fall
2. Self-induced misery
3. Suffering within families and nations
4. Discipline of the Father
5. Denial of rewards
6. Eternal suffering in the Lake of Fire

II. Indirect: Suffering not due to sin (caused by God's intervention)

John 9:1, “Now as Jesus passed by, He saw a man who was blind from birth.

John 9:2 “And His disciples asked Him, saying, ‘Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?’

John 9:3, “Jesus answered, ‘Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him.’ ”

Type of Suffering:

7. Suffering as God's wake-up call for salvation.

Affects: Unbelievers

God uses this specially designed suffering to shock or shake unbelievers to pay attention to His message.

Acts 9:1, “Then Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest”

Acts 9:3, “As he journeyed he came near Damascus, and suddenly a light shone around him from heaven.

Acts 9:4, “Then he fell to the ground, and heard a voice saying to him, ‘Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?’

Acts 9:5, “And he said, ‘Who are You, Lord?’ Then the Lord said, ‘I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. It is hard for you to kick against the goads.’ ”

Acts 9:6, “So he, trembling and astonished, said, ‘Lord, what do You want me to do?’ Then the Lord said to him, ‘Arise and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do.’”

Acts 9:7, “And the men who journeyed with him stood speechless, hearing a voice but seeing no one.”

Acts 9:8, “Then Saul arose from the ground, and when his eyes were opened he saw no one. But they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus.”

Acts 9:9, “And he was three days without sight, and neither ate nor drank.”

Type of Suffering:

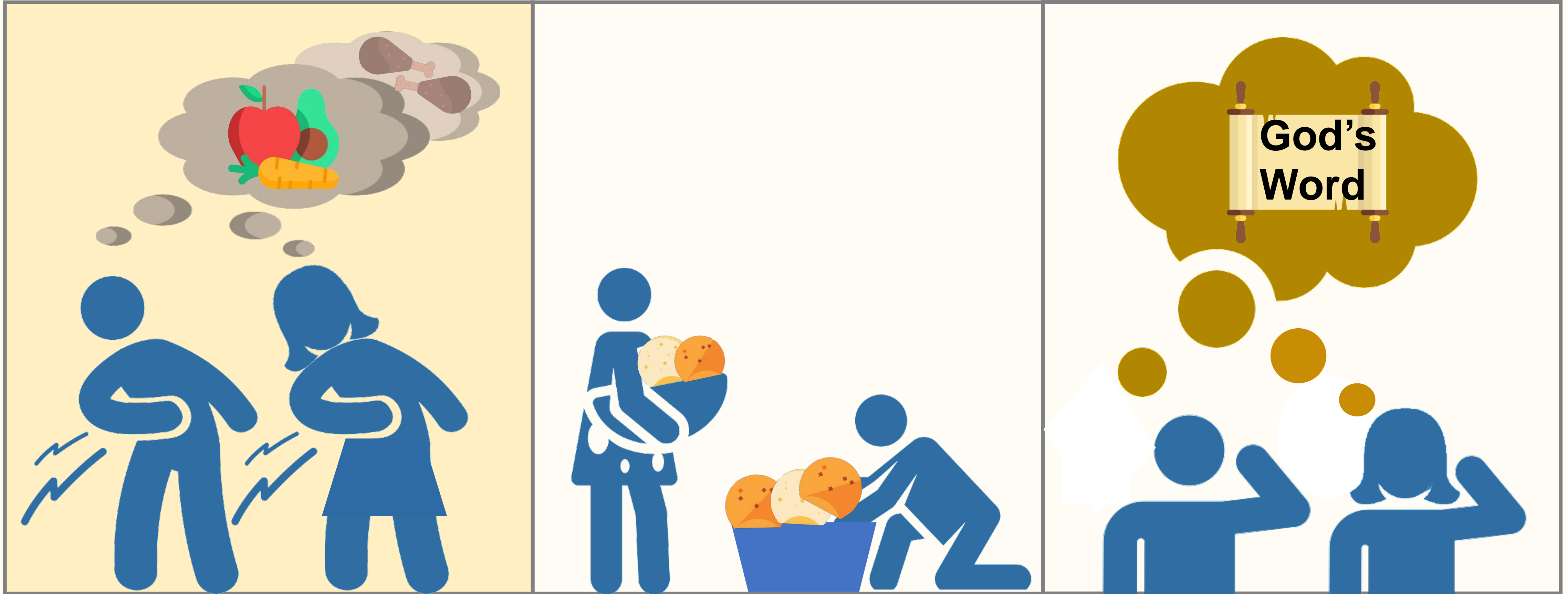
8. Suffering to push our spiritual growth.

Affects: Believers

This type of suffering is designed by God to push believers to grow spiritually.

Deut. 8:2, “And you shall remember that the LORD your God led you all the way these forty years in the wilderness, to humble you and test you, to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not.”

Deut. 8:3, “So He humbled you, allowed you to hunger, and fed you with manna which you did not know nor did your fathers know, that He might make you know that man shall not live by bread alone; but man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the LORD.”



Psa. 119:67, “Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep Your word.”

Psa. 119:71, “It is good for me that I have been afflicted, that I may learn Your statutes.”

Psa. 119:75, “I know, O LORD, that Your judgments are right, and that in faithfulness You have afflicted me.”

1 Pet. 5:6, “Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time,

1 Pet. 5:7, “by casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you.

1 Pet. 5:8, “Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.

1 Pet. 5:9, “Resist him, steadfast in the faith, because you know that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world.” [RD]

9. Suffering so unbelievers will believe in God.

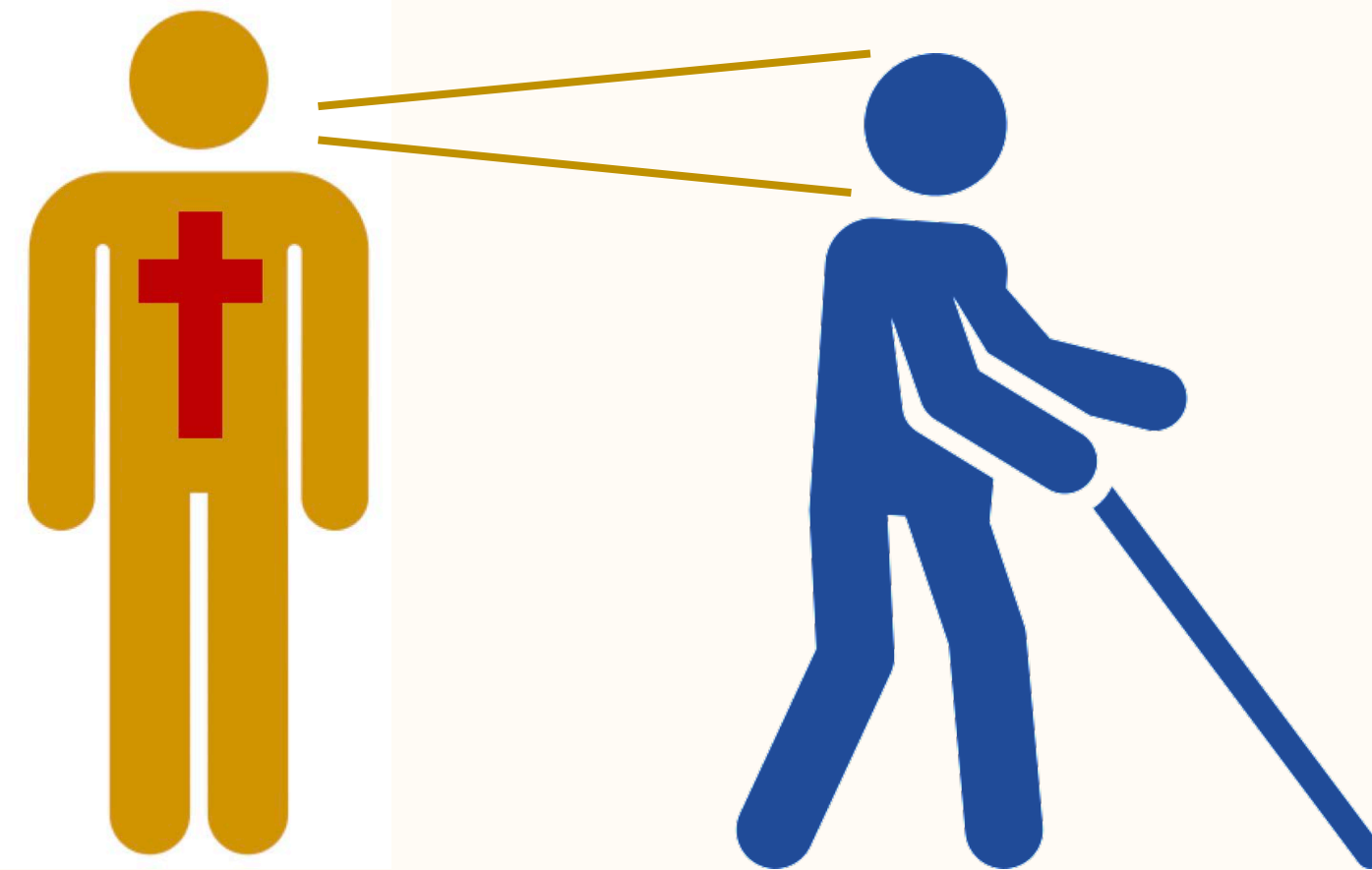
Affects: Believers

1 Tim. 1:15, “This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief.

1 Tim. 1:16, “However, for this reason I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might show all longsuffering, as a pattern to those who are going to believe on Him for everlasting life.”

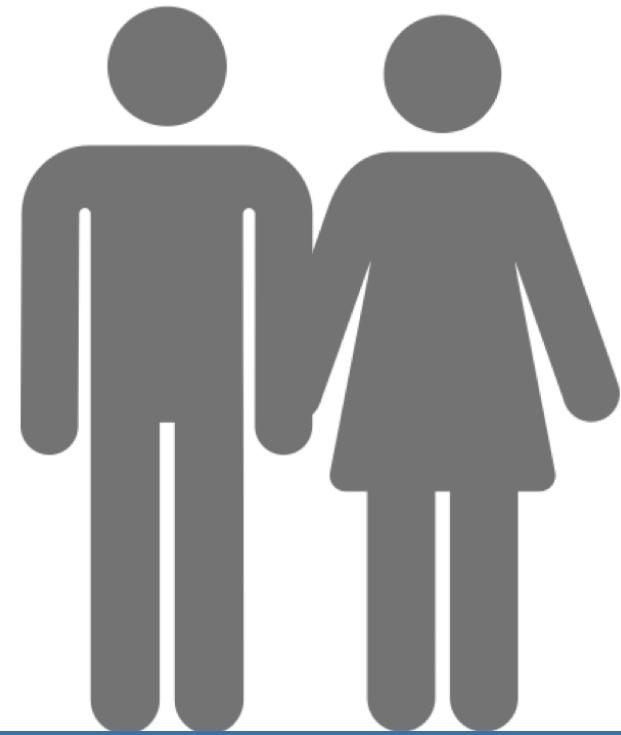


1 Pet. 2:21, “For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps:”

1 Pet. 3:14, “But even if you should suffer for righteousness’ sake, you are blessed. ‘And do not be afraid of their threats, nor be troubled.’”

Type of Suffering:

10. Suffering to encourage spiritual growth in other believers.

Affects: Believers

God sometimes uses our suffering to help others grow spiritually.

2 Cor. 1:4, “who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

2 Cor. 1:5, “For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also abounds through Christ.

2 Cor. 1:6, “Now if we are afflicted, it is for your consolation and salvation, which is effective for enduring the same sufferings which we also suffer. Or if we are comforted, it is for your consolation and salvation.”

2 Cor. 1:8, “For we do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, of our trouble which came to us in Asia: that we were burdened beyond measure, above strength, so that we despaired even of life.

2 Cor. 1:9, “Yes, we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves but in God who raises the dead,

2 Cor. 1:10, “who delivered us from so great a death, and does deliver us; in whom we trust that He will still deliver us,

2 Cor. 1:11, “you also helping together in prayer for us, that thanks may be given by many persons on our behalf for the gift granted to us through many.”

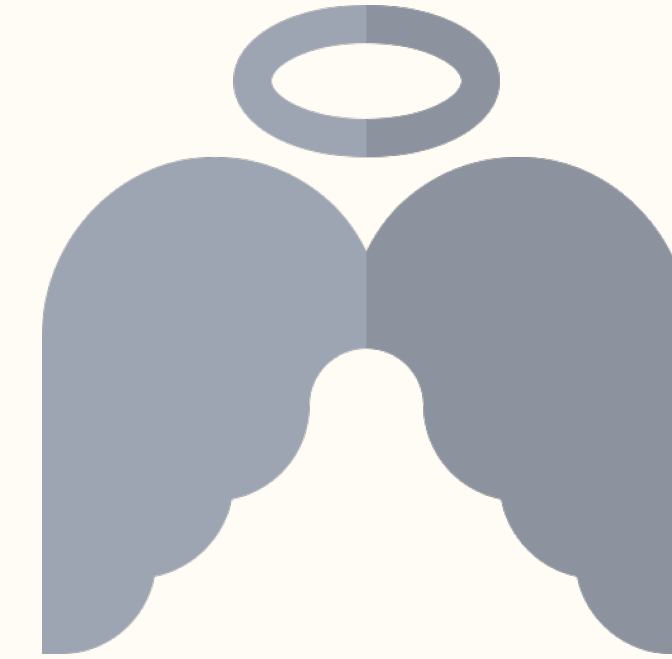
Type of Suffering:

11. Suffering because of what happens in the spiritual realm.

Affects: Believers

Events in the spiritual realm can cause suffering in the lives of believers.

Luke 22:31, “And the Lord said, ‘Simon, Simon! Indeed, Satan has asked for you, that he may sift you as wheat.

Luke 22:32, “ ‘But I have prayed for you, that your faith should not fail; and when you have returned to Me, strengthen your brethren.’ ”



3 Times Peter Denies Christ

4. When we suffer, we should first examine ourselves and prayerfully ask God to reveal if we are causing our own suffering through our pride or rebellion.

5. When we suffer, we should pray for God to remove our suffering. But we should also pray for God to help us bear and accept our suffering.

2 Cor. 12:6, “For though I might desire to boast, I will not be a fool; for I will speak the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think of me above what he sees me to be or hears from me.

2 Cor. 12:7, “And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger [*angelos* “demon”] of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure.”

2 Cor. 12:8, “Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me.

**2 Cor. 12:9, “And He said to me, ‘My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.’
Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.**

2 Cor. 12:10, “Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ’s sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong.”
